Permit Test @Home



Beginning March 2018 parents/legal guardians can administer an eligible teenager's Driver Knowledge Test from the convenience of their home.

To **qualify** as a test administrator a parent/legal guardian **must**:

- ✓ possess State-issued driver license or ID card.
- ✓ certify you are the examinee's parent/guardian.
- ✓ commit to administering the exam in a room or facility where access can be limited.
- ✓ ensure examinees do not have access to their mobile or electronic devices, documents, notes or writing materials during the exam.



Steps

1. Login or register your **AZ MVD Now** account at AZMVDNow.az.gov.

2. Verify your identity.

3. Select **Test From Home**.

4. Complete your teen's information.

5. Submit payment for the **\$7 application fee**.

6. Proctor/supervise your teen during the test.

Don't forget to complete the **Be Prepared** electronic application.

Sample Questions

When you see or hear an emergency vehicle approaching:

- Immediately drive to the right side of the road and stop
- Slow down and permit the emergency vehicle to pass
- Remain alert and stay to the right

A flashing red traffic light at an intersection means the:

- Same as a Stop sign
- Light is about to turn green
- Same as a Stop light

If you are parking uphill and there is no curb, you should:

- Turn your wheels to the right, toward the edge of the road
- Turn your wheels to the left, away from the edge of the road
- Keep your wheels straight ahead

FAQ

Is there a time limit to complete the test?

- A** | The examinee has 30 minutes from the time test is started.

When will we know the results of the test?

- A** | The test is scored as it progresses, so you will know the results immediately with an on-screen notification and email confirmation explaining next steps. A score of 80 percent or higher is required to pass.

What happens when a test is failed?

- A** | Additional attempts can be made. The \$7 fee allows three attempts at home or in an office. ⓘ

What happens if the internet connection is lost during the test?

- A** | If the connection is lost, try again. It will not count as an attempt.

Once they've passed the test, what are the next steps for my teenager to receive their instruction permit?

- A** | Upon passing, you will receive an email with instructions on next steps. For more information, visit the "Be Prepared" link referenced in the Quick QR Codes section of this brochure.

If my teenager completes and fails their first attempt at an on-site location can they take remaining attempts at home?

- A** | Yes, they can take the remaining attempts at home as long as it is administered by a parent/legal guardian.
